AUTHORIZING RESOLUTION

A Resolution to Authorize the Bonneville County Sheriff's Office to Purchase MPH Brand In-Car Video Camera Systems using the Sole Source Provision of Idaho Code §31-4003(2).

WHEREAS, the Bonneville County Sheriff's Office has standardized on the above brand and model of video camera equipment for patrol cars; and

WHEREAS, the MPH brand video camera system is the only video camera system compatible with the MPH brand radar equipment, allowing the radar speed readings to be captured in the recorded event; and

WHEREAS, there is no known interface compatibility among video camera system manufacturers; and

WHEREAS, the Bonneville County Sheriff's Office has MPH brand radar equipment installed in all marked patrol vehicles where in-car video systems will be installed;


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Bonneville County Board of Commissioners hereby authorizes the Bonneville County Sheriff's Office to purchase MPH Brand In-Car Video Camera Systems using the Sole Source Provision of Idaho Code §31-4003(2).



Idaho Statutes

TITLE 31
 COUNTIES AND COUNTY LAW
 CHAPTER 40
 EXPENDITURES AND BIDS

31-4003. EXPENDITURES FOR WHICH BIDS REQUIRED. (1) Unless otherwise provided in this chapter, when the expenditure contemplated exceeds five thousand dollars (\$5,000), but not twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000), the county shall obtain price or cost quotations from at least three (3) responsible vendors in the business of supplying such goods or services. To enhance small business bidding opportunities, the county shall seek a minimum of three (3) price quotations from registered vendors having a significant Idaho economic presence as defined in section 67-2349, Idaho Code. If the county finds that it is impractical or impossible to obtain three (3) quotations for the proposed transaction, the county may acquire the property in any manner the county deems best. The county shall then procure the goods or services from the responsible vendor quoting the lowest price. When the expenditure contemplated exceeds twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000), it shall be contracted for and let to the lowest responsible bidder. Where both the bids and quality of property offered are the same, preference shall be given to the property of local and domestic production and manufacture or from bidders having a significant Idaho economic presence as defined in section 67-2349, Idaho Code.

(2) Upon resolution by the board of county commissioners that there is only one (1) vendor as a source of procurement and the procurement involves a contract which does not exceed one (1) year, then notice of a sole source procurement shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation printed or published in the county or having general circulation in the county, at least ten (10) working days prior to the award of the contract. For purposes of this section, only one (1) vendor shall refer to situations where there is only one (1) source reasonably available, and shall include, but is not limited to

- (a) Where the compatibility of equipment, components, accessories, computer software, replacement parts or service is the paramount consideration;
- (b) Where a sole supplier's item is needed for trial use or testing;
- (c) Purchase of mass-produced movies, videos, books or other copyrighted materials;
- (d) Purchase of property for which it is determined there is no functional equivalent;
- (e) Purchase of public utility services;
- (f) Purchase of products, merchandise or trademarked goods for resale at a county facility; or
- (g) Where competitive solicitation is impractical, disadvantageous or unreasonable under the circumstances.

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
