### Bonneville County Resolution No. 06-01

A RESOLUTION, FOR THE COUNTY OF BONNEVILLE, IDAHO, REGARDING THE UNIFORM FIRE CODE AS ADOPTED, ESTABLISHING A DEPARTMENT OF FIRE PREVENTION, APPOINTING A FIRE CODE OFFICIAL, SETTING A MINIMUM FIRE HYDRANT FLOW STANDARD FOR SMALL RURAL SYSTEMS, ALLOWING FOR ADJUSTMENT UPWARD OF FIRE FLOW VOLUMES.

Whereas, the Board of Commissioners of Bonneville County, has the authority pursuant to Idaho Code to adopt rules and regulations controlling development within its jurisdiction; and

Whereas, the Board of Commissioners of Bonneville County, has adopted the Uniform Fire Code for the protection of the public within Bonneville County; and

Whereas, the Board of Commissioners of Bonneville County, has determined that there is not a single fire department controlling all of Bonneville County; and

Whereas, the Board of Commissioners of Bonneville County, has determined that uniform enforcement of the code is essential for making consistent decisions and the health and safety of the citizens of Bonneville County.

Now therefore, be it hereby resolved by the Board of Commissioners of Bonneville County, the appointments and clarifications pursuant to the International Fire Code are adopted as follows:

#### Appointments:

##### Section 103.1

The department of fire protection duties for Bonneville County shall be assigned to the Bonneville County Planning Zoning and Building Department.

##### Section 103.2

The administrator of the Bonneville County Planning Zoning and Building Department is appointed as the Fire Code Official and Fire Marshal for Bonneville County.

#### Modifications:

##### Section B103

In as much as a majority of the rural areas of Bonneville County are not served by large municipal or central water systems that are capable of providing full fire flow requirements and whereas the Board of County Commissioners for Bonneville County has determined that it is impractical to provide full fire flow requirements in rural areas and in


small neighborhoods and communities and whereas it is found in the public interest to still provide where practical a reduced water volume with which to fight fires, the following adjustments are made as allowed for in the fire code: all small rural water systems must be capable of providing a minimum flow of 250 GPM for a two hour period with a minimum residual pressure of 20 PSI. This flow may be adjusted up depending on other factors such as fire hazard, commercial use, current water demand and future size of the development. Developments on larger water systems will still be required to comply with normal flow regulations.


**Effective Date**


This resolution shall be in full force and effect upon the passage and approval by the Board of County Commissioners of Bonneville County and shall take effect immediately upon the execution of this resolution.
